

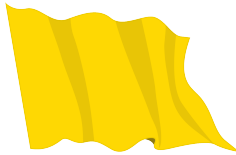
TRACK FLAGS MEANINGS



CHECKERED – the session is ending, gradually slow down and allow your car to cool down, enter pit lane and proceed to the paddock



BLUE - passing signal, a faster car is behind you, give the approaching driver a point by to pass you in the next passing zone



YELLOW (STANDING) - something has happened ahead of you but the incident is off the track surface, proceed with caution, no passing

YELLOW (WAVING) - something has happened ahead of you that is on the track surface and may be in the way of the racing line, slow down and be prepared to take evasive action, no passing



GREEN - the session has begun or the track is clear, passing is allowed



RED – an incident has happened on track and all cars must come to a complete stop. Come to a gradual, controlled stop on the right side of the track, or if you can see the incident nearby pull off on the opposite side from where the crash is. Remain in vehicle (unless it is on fire) with seatbelt on until a steward gives further instruction.



YELLOW WITH RED STRIPES - there is something on the surface of the track such as debris or parts from another car, dirt, oil or even an animal that can hinder traction or cause damage



BLACK – an infraction has occurred, enter the pits during that lap



BLACK WITH ORANGE CENTER "MEATBALL" - your car is showing mechanical issues such as billowing smoke, dripping oil, or throwing sparks out of your brakes, enter pit lane that lap and proceed to track steward

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
